

2019 Year in Review

2019 has been an exciting year in the history of the Perth and District Community Foundation, with an increase in our endowment fund we were be able to fund a greater number of projects and address emerging opportunities. New partnership opportunities with the private sector and the federal government has increased the profile of the community foundation and will provide additional financial resources to community groups in the County of Lanark.

President's Report – Jean Dunning

2019 has proved to be a watershed year in the development and growth of our Community Foundation. Assets under management have reached almost \$3 million thanks to donations in 2019 totalling over \$270,000. With the growth in the endowment fund, PDCF provided grants and scholarships of over \$175,000 to the community, bringing our total grants to just under \$1 million since 2002. Collaboration and cooperation are the keys to success and this past year, three unique partnerships were undertaken.



With a generous grant from the **Loblaw Foundation** and the **Community Foundations of Canada**, PDCF undertook a study called **Growing Community Meals in Lanark County**, with a goal of determining how best to expand and improve the community meal experiences in Lanark County.

The study is an outgrowth of the Vital Signs Report that the

PDCF spearheaded in 2017, which identified a number of key issues related to transportation issues, healthy eating and loneliness among vulnerable youth, seniors and low-income families.



PDCF was excited to host the national Royal Bank of Canada,
Future Launch Community Challenge, making up to \$15,000
available for youth-led innovative projects in Lanark County that
addresses urgent community needs. We would like to recognize
the importance RBC has placed in helping youth in rural areas to
access these funds. While talented youth abound in Canada,
access and the opportunity for rural youth to access funding is limited.







This past June, **Community Foundations of Canada** in cooperation with the **Government of Canada** announced the **Investment Readiness Program** to provide non-repayable funds to organizations preparing to successfully participate in the social finance market. PDCF is one of regional partners delivering the program on behalf of the Community Foundations of Canada. Successful applicants will get between \$10,000-\$100,000 to invest in their social enterprise and make an even greater positive change in their community.

caring community; creative partnerships allow us to get things done.




Table One. Grants and scholarship disbursement by sector for the period 2003-2019
