


#### 2020 Year in Review

2020 has been an unsettled year in the history of the Perth and District Community Foundation due to the COVID-19 pandemic. The pandemic has created opportunities for us to develop new partnerships with both the private sector and the federal government. Those partnerships have increased the profile of the community foundation and increased our ability to provide additional financial resources to community groups in the County of Lanark.

### President's Report – Jean Dunning

2020 has proven to be a watershed year in the development and growth of our Community Foundation. Assets under management have reached over \$3.6 million. The growth is thanks to more than 400 donors who donated over \$268,000.00 in 2020! Currently 47 charities, service clubs, families and organizations have established endowment funds with PDCF. With the growth in the endowment fund, PDCF provided a record number of grants and scholarships of over

\$217,000 to the community through providing over 50 grants. This brings our total grants to over \$1.3 million since 2002. Collaboration and cooperation are the keys to success and this past year, four unique partnerships were undertaken: Royal Bank of Canada, Lawson Foundation, Community Foundations Canada and the Canadian Federal Government.

PDCF was excited to host the national **Royal Bank of Canada, Future Launch Community Challenge**, which made \$15,000 available for youth-led innovative projects in Lanark County that addresses urgent community needs.
